

ANTE-MORTEM INSPECTION REPORT FOR FOOD ANIMALS

- A. General Instruction for ante-mortem inspection
 - the abattoir should have certain minimum requirements to enable adequate ante-mortem inspection to be conducted satisfactorily
 - Only animals which have been adequately rested shall be presented for ante-mortem inspection
 - Only clean animal should be presented for ante-mortem inspection
 - to screen all animals destined to slaughter.
 - to ensure that animals are properly rested and that proper clinical information, which will assist in the disease diagnosis and judgement, is obtained.
 - to ensure that injured animals or those with pain and suffering receive emergency slaughter and that animals are treated humanely.
 - to identify reportable animal diseases to prevent premise contamination.
 - to identify sick animals and those animal who received treatment

Ante-mortem inspection should be carried out in adequate lighting where the animals can be observed both collectively and individually at rest and motion. The general behaviour of animals should be observed, as well as their nutritional status, cleanliness, signs of diseases and abnormalities.
